Paediatric Clinical Guidelines

PiP continue to work with The Bedside Clinical Guidelines Partnership (BCGP) to develop and update paediatric clinical guidelines.

Over recent months our clinical lead Dr Anjum Gandhi has been working through the guidelines along with the BCGP to recruit new authors and reviewers from our membership organisations.

We continue to work to ensure robust and quality assured guidelines are produced that are of value to our members.

The guidelines are reviewed on a 2-yearly cycle; they help consultants, junior doctors and nurses maintain high quality and consistent practice. The next edition (10) aims to be available January 2025.





Dr Gandhi and the team are also looking to develop an additional resource focused on Paediatric Community Guidelines.

We will update members on the development of this over the next 12 months!!



NETWORK LAUNCH Paediatric Liver AHP & Nursing Network

Partners in Paediatrics would like to share news of a newly formulated network for Paediatric Nurses and Allied Health Professionals (AHP's) working with children and young people in liver and transplant care.

The network aims to provide peer support, learning opportunities, educational resources, and sharing of our expertise within the specialty.

We aim to provide advice and guidance for professionals nationally. In doing this we hope to support service development and standardise practice through collaborative working at national level.

Midlands Childrens Long Term Ventilation Network (MCLTVN) MCLTVN Quality Standards for Long-term Ventilation for Children and Young People Version 5

The MCLTVN continue to share and develop the circulation of the LTV Quality Standards for LTV V5. The Quality Standards aim to improve the quality of services for children and young people needing long-term ventilation.

The standards help to answer the question: "For each service, how will I know that national guidance and evidence of best practice have been implemented?" They describe what services should be aiming to provide and all services should be working towards meeting all applicable Quality Standards within the next two years.

The Quality Standards are based on and support implementation of national strategies and guidance, including NICE guidance and Quality Standards

The network are currently working to develop their own self-assessment framework – details of this should be available over the next six months.
