The Good Childhood Report 2018, produced in partnership with the University of York, is the seventh in a series of annual reports published by The Children's Society about how children in the UK feel about their lives. The Children's Society had prior to the release of this report, released findings that one in six (16%) of more than 11,000 children surveyed reported self-harming at the age of 14 including nearly one in 10 boys (9%) and one in 4 girls.
