NICEimpact children and young people's Health care (June 2020). Since 2004, NICE has published an extensive suite of guidance and advice on children and young people, including 72 guidelines. In June 2020 they published an impact analysis of the recommendations included in this guidance. The areas looked at in more detail in relation to our age group (10-24) included:

- Prescription of antibiotics for common infections
- Managing long term conditions in the community (particularly asthma, diabetes, epilepsy and mental health)
- Annual physical health checks for all children, young people and adults with a learning disability (only approximately a quarter of 10-19 year olds get these)
- Transition from child to adult services
- Innovative technologies for children's conditions including cancer treatments
